ServSTEUBEN MRC Volunteer Response Drill – April 2019

ServSTEUBEN MRC uses notification messages to communicate our needs to MRC volunteers. Pressing “9” after listening to the phone message, or by clicking on the email acknowledgement link, tells us only that you received the message. That is helpful information, but if we need you as a volunteer we need to know when you would be available to help us – and the only way to find out is if **you tell us**.

Always take the time to read and follow the directions given in a ServSTEUBEN MRC notification message. During an emergency we would request that you call a phone number given to you in the notification. Call that number to tell us if you are available to help. In early April 2019 we will run a drill notification to test this process.

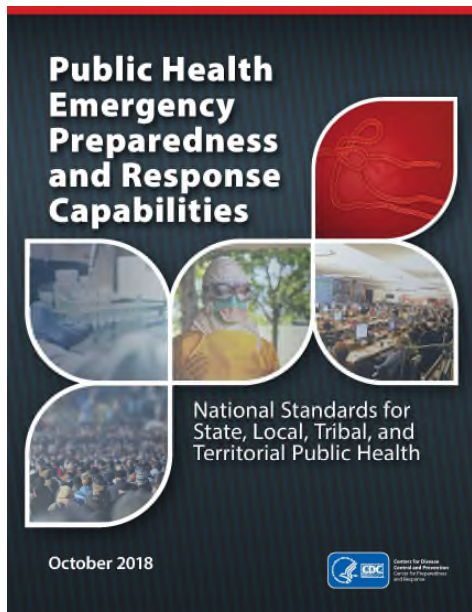

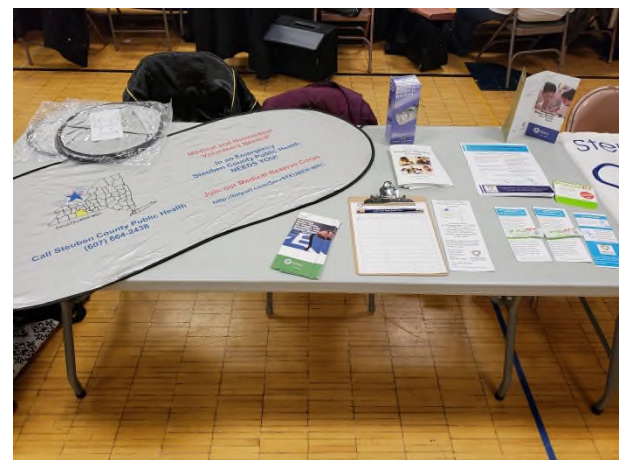
**Have you completed the Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100 Course?**
